- **Michigan Tech** – Good morning! Drags were pulled on the skate lanes this morning. Please bear with us as we are waiting on parts for the cats. Conditions are very good. (2/10/2026)
- **Swedetown** – Good morning all! All ski trails have been freshly groomed and tracked with the Husky this morning, to mix in the snow bombs and tree debris from yesterday's warmup. I was able to get companion tracks set on most of Greenstone but not on the other trails. Conditions will be a bit soft for a few hours, but should set up as the day goes on. The Multi-Use-Loops (MUT) have been freshly groomed and tracked, and all 5 of the snowbike loops have been dragged fresh this morning. Please, if you are able, toss sticks and branches to the side of the trail when you come across them. Enjoy your ski! (2/11/2026)
- **Swedetown Snow Bike** - Good sunny afternoon!! Loops 1-3 got a quick drag to knock down all the snow bombs and get all the sticks after last night. The trail is setting up beautifully and it is a gorgeous day to enjoy a ride! (2/6/2026)
- **Chassell Ski Trails** - Blades down on the Ginzu to mix in recent snow and set new tracks. (2/7/2026)
- **Chassell Snowshoe Trails** - All 3 loops and the Green Trail have been walked over once with my Iverson's Michigan-style 'woodies' yesterday and today. People have asked me which snowshoe type, the wooden or aluminum, is best. While I will always prefer my quiet woodies that I have used for over 40 years as a forester, the aluminum/traction snowshoes would be the better all-around choice. I consider my 13" x 46" Michigan's as my "floaters" that can carry me into the woods on deep fresh snow easier than the aluminums. As a now retired forester marking trees and running boundary line's, I was always breaking snow the entire day. The Michigan's have about 440 sq. in. footprint. The average aluminum is in the 270-320 sq. in. footprint range. I do have a pair of 28"aluminum's that I would use on crusty snowfields. (2/1/2026)
- **Churning Rapids & Maasto** – Churning rapids groomed this morning. (2/10/2026)
- **Churning Rapids Snow Bike** - Trails groomed around noon on Friday. Used the Vplow to push off a little soft snow and maintain the solid base. Riding should be good through the weekend. (2/6/2026)
