- **Michigan Tech** – It's another perfect winter day. All the main trails were groomed and tracked with the bombardier. River Trail is about to be addressed. Tolkien should just have a little bit of fluff on it. It looks like another great day for skiing, have a lot of fun. (2/3/2026)
- **Swedetown** – Good morning all! It's another beautiful winter morning at Swedetown today. All main ski trails are freshly groomed and tracked with the Husky, the multi-use loops have been groomed and tracked with snowmobiles, and loops 1-3 of the snowbike trails are freshly dragged. Conditions are excellent, just watch out for snowbombs! Companion tracks are set on Valley, Greenstone, Cedar, and Tamarack. If you come across branches in the trail, please take the time to pick them up and throw them to the side of the trail, it helps out the groomers quite a bit. Thank you and Enjoy your ski! (2/2/2026)
- **Swedetown Snow Bike** - Loops 1-3 are beautiful today, loops 4 and 5 are not groomed. (2/2/2026)
- **Chassell Ski Trails** - Dragged, ran the ginzu with blades down, and set tracks. (1/30/2026)
- **Chassell Snowshoe Trails** - All 3 loops and the Green Trail have been walked over once with my Iverson's Michigan-style 'woodies' yesterday and today. People have asked me which snowshoe type, the wooden or aluminum, is best. While I will always prefer my quiet woodies that I have used for over 40 years as a forester, the aluminum/traction snowshoes would be the better all-around choice. I consider my 13" x 46" Michigan's as my "floaters" that can carry me into the woods on deep fresh snow easier than the aluminums. As a now retired forester marking trees and running boundary line's, I was always breaking snow the entire day. The Michigan's have about 440 sq. in. footprint. The average aluminum is in the 270-320 sq. in. footprint range. I do have a pair of 28"aluminum's that I would use on crusty snowfields. (2/1/2026)
- **Churning Rapids & Maasto** –All trails have been groomed. Some Saturday and some Sunday. (2/1/2026)
- **Churning Rapids Snow Bike** - Trails groomed Monday evening. Should be good for riding this week. (2/2/2026)
- **Eagle Harbor Ski Trails** – Looking good out there, did not hit the Wellhead Loop, but all is in good shape. Get out there! (2/1/2026)
- **Copper Harbor Trails Club "End of the Road Trails"** – Beautiful mid-winter conditions out there. Enjoy!! (1/31/2026)
- **Copper Harbor Trails** - Rolled with a nice soft pack base. A good bit of new snow over the last week. Conditions are excellent with the cold temperatures. Be aware that the loop through Fort Wilkins is abbreviated on the east end due to construction in the East Campground. If you are skiing east along Lake Fanny Hooe there is a hard turn north into the playground/picnic area that loops back towards the campground main entrance building. (1/24/2026)
